How to Register for Community Corrections Connect

- 1. Go to https://appa.reliasacademy.com
- 2. Create an account (if you don't have one already). To create an account, click the login button in the upper right corner of the screen and then click "Create an Account" and follow the instructions.
- 3. After you register and are logged in, click the "CC Connect" link that appears above the top navigation bar.
- 4. The first time you access CC Connect this way, you will see a dialogue box that asks you to confirm the email address you want to use with the site. Click the login button to confirm.
- 5. Review terms and conditions page, and if you agree to the terms and conditions, check the "I agree" box and click Accept.
- 6. This will take you to the Overview page of Relias Connect.
- 7. Copy and paste this URL in the web address bar. https://rlconnect.reliaslearning.com/groups/community-community-corrections-connect. This will take you to the overview page of Community Corrections Connect, which is an online professional development networking community managed by the American Probation and Parole Association for community corrections professionals.
