He was appointed to this position in 2003 by the Chief Judge of Minnesota's First Judicial District. He has held multiple positions in the field of community corrections since 1985, including police reserve officer, volunteer probation officer, community corrections worker, senior probation officer, program manager, cognitive interventions coordinator, community corrections supervisor, and director. John worked with the Ramsey County Community Corrections Department in St. Paul, MN for three years, and he served for 15 years with the Washington County Community Corrections Department in Stillwater, MN.

John holds a BA degree in sociology: criminology, law and deviance, from the University of Minnesota, and an MS degree in human services planning and administration from the sociology and corrections department at Minnesota State University, Mankato. John is also an adjunct professor/instructor with the Minnesota State University in Mankato, teaching in the sociology and corrections department. Since 1995, John has conducted numerous training sessions for correctional practitioners and completed several research projects related to evidence-based practices in corrections. Since 2004, John has participated on and chaired (2005-2007) the statewide Evidence-Based Practices Policy Team in conjunction with the Minnesota Department of Corrections and the Commissioner of Corrections.
