

Training Announcement:

Community Corrections Strategies for Supervising Those Victimized by Domestic Violence

Event Details: The date of the event is Tuesday, September 25, 2018 from 8:00-5:00 PM local time, and it will be held at the Ramada located at 777 W. Cushing Street, **Tucson, Arizona**.

Event Description: This one-day training event is designed to provide specialized training and technical assistance to improve the capacity of community corrections personnel to identify individuals on community supervision who have been victimized by Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) and to assure that officers are using trauma-informed approaches to supervision that will protect the supervisee's safety, yet still hold him/her accountable for his/her crime. Using a blended-training curriculum of online course work and classroom instruction, participants will be better equipped to address the needs of this population. Applicants may apply for this training individually, but are encouraged to apply as part of a team of two or more persons per agency.

Training/Learning Objectives:

- Identify strategies that can be used during the supervision process to identify individuals who have been abused by intimate partners.
- Once abuse is identified, the importance of re-assessing the supervision plan and supervision strategies to assure they are based on trauma-informed approaches and promote individual safety, while still holding him/her accountable for his/her crime.
- Understand the benefits to partnering and collaborating with domestic violence victim service providers/advocates to address victims' needs.
