Blended Learning

This is a blended-learning event. Participants will be required to complete online lessons prior to the on-site skill-building training event.

Once on site, participants will be engaged in skill-building activities designed to provide practice and coaching on the training topics. Participants will be given a case to work from arrest to revocation/completion and conduct practice interviews with defendants/probationers, family members, victims, employers, neighbors, children, etc. and use the interview information to develop a variety of reports including pretrial reports, presentence investigations, pre-sentence recommendations, case notes, and a variety of other supervision-related forms and reports. Participants will leave the training with templates of a variety of forms to use in their own jurisdictions.
