

NODRC FACTS

- All programming and services are designed specifically to help reduce recidivism and prevent participants from returning to jail.
- Participants will develop an Individual Treatment Plan that includes goals specific to their needs. With the assistance of case managers and other support staff, clients strive to accomplish their personal goals.
- The NODRC program measures recidivism rates to evaluate program effectiveness and success. Since the program's inception in 2009, recidivism rates of all the individuals enrolled have been reduced each year by 20% or greater.
- All services are at no cost to participants, including court mandated classes, bus tokens, and a hot lunch.

The New Orleans Day Reporting Center program strives to reduce the cycle of recidivism of individuals under the supervision of Probation and Parole. This program encourages a therapeutic community, recognizes individual strengths, increases self-awareness, and teaches participants the tools necessary to maintain separation from the criminal justice system. NODRC provides participants with opportunities in education, substance abuse treatment, individual and group work, employment, anger management, and other wrap-around services to increase the participants' ability to be a successful member of our community.

PROGRAM FUNDAMENTALS

The NODRC is a 90-day program for individuals on Probation and Parole with East Jefferson and Orleans Districts.

Three criteria to enroll in the program:

1. Must have at least 6 months remaining on their supervision
2. May not be a registered sex offender
3. May not have a pending felony



Individuals may be referred by Probation and Parole officers, the Parole Board or a judge.
