Releasee/Parolee [name]:

As an offender on mandatory supervised release/parole, you are to refrain from possessing a firearm or other dangerous weapon. It continues to be the policy of IDOC to violate offenders not in compliance with this condition.

Your name has come to the attention of federal law enforcement because of your arrest and prosecution by state and local authorities. <u>Any</u> future offense by you involving the use or mere possession of a firearm or ammunition will be reviewed by the United States Attorney's Office for <u>federal prosecution</u>. This new procedure is part of a federally funded program named Project Safe Neighborhoods. As a convicted felon, you can be prosecuted in federal court for simply possessing a firearm, which typically results in a <u>five year sentence</u>, and you may be eligible to be prosecuted as an Armed Career Criminal, which carries a <u>minimum sentence of fifteen years</u> in a federal prison without any possibility of parole.

If convicted in federal court, your sentence of imprisonment will be served in one of the federal prisons across the United States. Again, the federal system has <u>no parole</u> and no "day-for-a-day" good time credit.
